**YOU'RE IN!**



If you belong to the Cincinnati Art Club you probably know Tim Boone! A member for 18 years, Tim served as president from 2006-2008, leading the Club onto solid financial footing.

Tim is a sculptor who studied with John Leon for 6 years, and still considers John to be his mentor. Tim's primary mediums are bronze and limestone, but he has begun working with cloth mache' which he finds easier on his hands. His inspiration comes from many things – magazines, museums, art galleries, art shows, patterned tile, even 2D artworks that he can translate into 3D. Tim sees pattern in design everywhere, just as one sees objects in the clouds. He enjoys creating the unexpected in stone or bronze, and once carved a fat man and a skinny woman on a teeter totter - quite a challenge to carve such a delicate scenario out of stone!

When Tim works in stone he often first creates a clay study to act as a "tour guide" for the carving. Unlike paint which can be wiped off if a mistake is made, stone is much less accommodating. While he enjoys the thrill of completing a new sculpture, Tim claims to be insecure regarding his work, occasionally becoming discouraged. Then he will wait until a new idea comes along to reinvigorate him. Even with those occasional frustrations, Tim, who runs an insurance and investment company, says that if he could pay all the bills with his art, he would never "work" another day in his life – only sculpt.

Even though he has yet to create that one special monumental sculpture, Tim has had his share of success.



According to Tim, his most important art accomplishment is a featured piece located in St. Xavier High School's art gallery which sits just outside the principal's office – a limestone carving of their mascot - a bomber pilot. Tim enjoys the irony of this, since he is a Moeller grad! (For anyone not a Cincinnati native, there is a great rivalry between all of the Catholic boy's schools here.)

Tim is not the only artistic Boone! He continuously speaks highly of wife Jan (who we will meet in an upcoming Focus Artist article) and the entire family is involved in the arts. Son Christopher holds a Master's degree from Brandeis University and has won three Emmys for his work in TV and theatre set design. Daughter Jessie holds a Master's degree from Savannah College of Art and Design and currently works in advertising. She is also an oil painter. Tim's daughter-in-law, a Conservatory trained pianist, teaches and owns her own business and is highly regarded in Cincinnati.

When asked whether he has hobbies other than art, Tim states that wife Jan is his hobby! Due to her involvement in charitable projects, Tim spends much of his free time working with her and states he would rather spend time with Jan than anyone or anything else.

Tim's advice for artists sounds like the Nike slogan – "just do it!" He says to do it, keep doing it and find a supportive partner; then you will become a success. While not a formal teacher, Tim says he is always willing to give you his opinion!



Tim can see himself continuing to sculpt and experiment with new ideas and new media well into the future!

Well, Tim, even though we cannot pay you with money for your thoughtful answers which took forever, we can pay you with our continued support and compliments on your beautiful work – and congratulate you on your good sense for choosing to make Jan your life partner!
