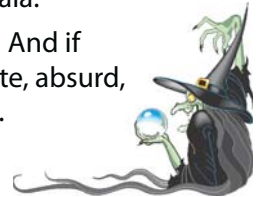
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

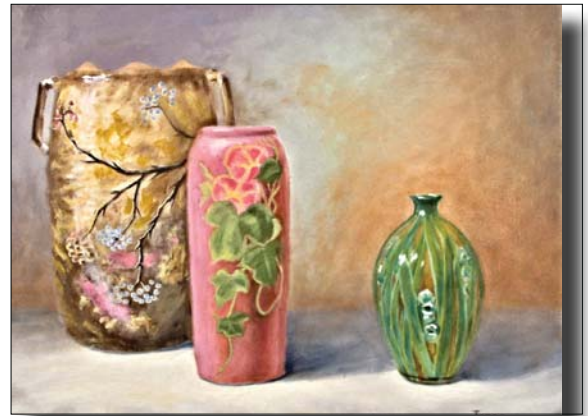

Irene Paian

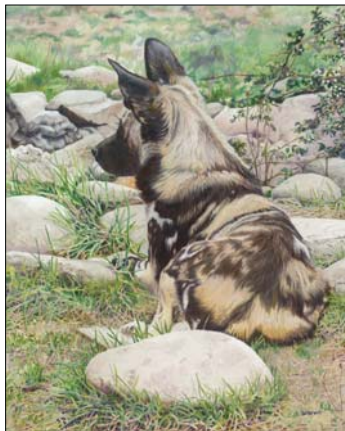

African Painted Dog I

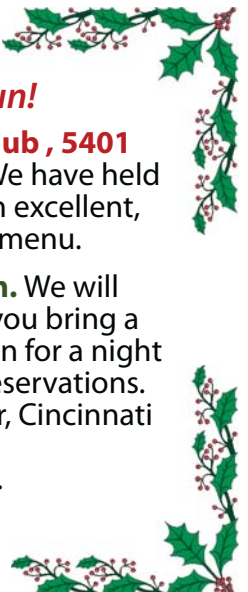

YOU'RE IN!

Jan is the other half of Tim and Jan Boone and mother of creative kids Chris and Jessie! She has been a member of the CAC since the 1990s, but has never held an office.

After graduating with a BFA from Miami University, Jan worked for Gibson Greeting Cards for 20 years and has been an "everyday painter" and instructor for over 10 years.

Working in oils and using pastels for studies, Jan finds inspiration for her paintings "everywhere". She takes her painting approach from Renoir, creating beautiful paintings to make you feel good. Jan believes that her work reminds people of happy times and beautiful memories and can improve a person's attitude. You will forget life's ugly moments when you look at Jan's scenes of Cincinnati, Ohio farms and rivers, quite often filled with people. She also enjoys painting pets and still lifes – an unending list of beautiful paintings to her credit.

While she considers herself successful, Jan is never completely satisfied with her work and always strives to improve. Jan says she gets cranky if she has to spend a few days away from her easel and always enjoys painting in her comfortable studio. In the rare instance of "painter's block", she might visit one of the city's museums or browse through art magazines or look through her photos. When she finds something with potential, she puts a Post It™ note on it for future painting reference. Like all of us, Jan enjoys hearing "wow" or watching people experience emotion while viewing her paintings. Her greatest art accomplishment to date is a

painting of Music Hall which was purchased by a prominent Cincinnati and then donated to 3CDC for their offices.

When asked about her usual method for creating a painting, Jan states:

"I'm very methodical. If I'm going to spend time on a larger canvas, I carefully craft the composition, do a pastel study to determine the color scheme, and attack the canvas with a very clear vision of the end result. I grid the canvas to match the grid on my photo, which is displayed on a flat screen in my studio. The painting is built in layers, but usually comes together very quickly. Maybe it's because I listen to murder mysteries while I paint."

Jan believes that an arts degree can help you if your career is with a large company, but:

"If your goal is to be a successful artist and make a living at your craft, then study with other artists or go to an art school and leave the university behind. My degree opened doors for me, but I'm not sure that will always be the case."

Jan's hobbies are gardening, fishing and camping and believes that the time spent outside helps her clear her head. She has recently started playing with clay and finds that enjoyable. She also teaches oil painting at The Barn and in her home studio, which she finds very rewarding.

Jan's advice to struggling artists? "Keep your day job, but keep pushing. A friend once told me it's a very noble thing to work at any job to support your art."

For the past two years Jan has done a '30 paintings in 30 days' project in the month of January that really kick-starts her year with a few sales and a fistful of studies to make larger paintings from.

Jan states that in the future you will find her in her studio, finding out 'who done it' while she paints her masterpieces!
